Citrus Rootstock Field Day, March 7, Babson Park

The CRDF will be conducting a citrus rootstock field day on Wednesday, March 7 at Peace River Packing Company grove located at the intersection of Murray and Lambs Road, Babson Park. This trial is part of a large replicated, multi-location trial to investigate HLB tolerance by looking at UF and USDA rootstocks. Rootstocks in the trial include: US-812, US-897, US-942, UFR-2, UFR-3, UFR-4, UFR- 16 and Carrizo. Horticultural performance will be discussed along with the distribution of summary data
