

Grower Round Table & Diaprepes Management, May 15, Wauchula

Peace River Valley Citrus Growers Association and UF/IFAS Extension will be conducting a grower round table meeting on Tuesday, May 15 at the Hardee County Extension Service office beginning at 8 AM and with an update on Diaprepes management beginning at 9:30 AM.

The purpose of the meeting from 8:00-9:30 AM is to allow growers to discuss their observations related to HLB, psyllid management, yields and current crop condition and then followed by a presentation by Dr. Larry Duncan. Dr. Duncan will highlight his trials using parasitic nematodes to control Diaprepes larva in the soil as well as foliar sprays to manage adults in the tree canopy.
