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

#### WHIP, September 4, 6:30 PM,

An area WHIP (Wildfire, Hurricane Indemnity Program) meeting for citrus will be conducted in Arcadia at the Turner Center Exhibit Hall, 2260 Roan Street. This program is being administered by the Farm Service Agency (FSA) and provides disaster assistance related to Hurricane Irma for citrus and other crops. This meeting is specific to the citrus indemnity program.

A representative from the Farm Service Agency will be discussing the WHIP program and eligibility requirements during the meeting. The office in Wauchula handles the FSA program for DeSoto, Hardee, Manatee and Sarasota.

The WHIP program officially began on July 16, 2018. Farm Service Agency offices can provide fact sheets and printed program information related to WHIP as well as other FSA programs.

In addition to WHIP, the Florida Division of Emergency Management (DEM) will offer block grants that contain \$340 million for citrus growers that conduct specific programs. DEM personnel will also be located at FSA offices to assist with their programs.

# 2017-18 Citrus Summary, Production, Price and Value, Production by County and Per Tree Report

The annual citrus summary was published on August 28 and lists Polk County as the number one citrus producing county in the state followed by Highlands County as the number two producer and then followed by DeSoto as the number 3 producing county. The top five counties with their production are listed.

# Beyond Basic Produce Food Safety: A Hands-On Analysis

This program is an interactive one-day workshop targeted to fresh fruit and/or vegetable growers, harvesters, and packers that turns farm food safety management into an engaging, hands-on and thought provoking exercise.

Working in small groups, you'll perform a hazard analysis for a working citrus grove and packinghouse. You'll work to identify the root cause of a potential food safety issue and correct the problem (hands-on) and document the corrective action in an example food safety plan.

After completing this workshop, you'll leave

with an improved understanding of food safety principles and practices that support the production of safe food, as well as Produce Safety Rule compliance, through the visualization of key, real-life, food safety issues discovered through hands-on, problembased scenarios; and you'll learn to see your operation through the eyes of a microbiologist and practice implementing procedures to reduce the risks in your own operation.

It's highly recommended that you attend a Produce Safety Alliance Grower Training Course prior to attending the "Beyond Basic Produce Food Safety" workshop.
