Firewall & Fireline Pointers

The following are some pointers from the meeting held by AgroSource at the Highlands County Ag Center last week. <u>I</u> am in no way promoting or recommending these products but felt it my duty to pass along some important specific points about the products and the meeting.

- MOST IMPORTANT THING OF ALL: the application of this product is bound by the Commissioner's Crisis
 Declaration letter not any product label. You must have a copy of the declaration with you when spraying the
 material.
- If the EPA denies the Section 18 the Commissioner's Crisis Declaration letter is no longer valid.
- Need to use both products in rotation
- Proven Safe for Bees
- · Night Spraying IS NOT recommended

What is meant by flush? As much flush as you can get (a couple of weeks after flush starts) not just when it starts.

- Use of Adjuvants (spreader/stickers) Greatly Increase success
- Resistance Monitoring is huge for the EPA
- We have to continually prove resistance is not happening
