Postbloom Fruit Drop (PFD) Recommendations

PFD has historically been the most severe on navel and Valencia oranges in Florida. Severity will vary according to the time of bloom in relation to rainfall and disease history in a block. Groves with persistent calyxes (buttons) from the previous year should be monitored twice weekly once the bloom begins. We've experienced a relatively wet winter up to this date and the forecast is for above average rainfall for the spring period. A PFD disease prediction model, called the PFD-FAD system, has been developed that takes into consideration the disease history in the grove, the cultivar susceptibility and the time of the last fungicide application. A link to that model can be found at the end of this paragraph. Pesticide recommendations for PFD control can be found on page 107 of the 2010 Citrus Pest Management Guide, SP 43. Pesticides recommended for control of PFD include Abound, Gem, Headline and Ferbam. Ferbam is not sufficiently effective to be used alone but can be combined with low rates of the other products to maximize protection and reduce the risk of resistance development.

St. Lucie Soil and Water Conservation District Mobile Irrigation Lab

One of the free public services offered by the St. Lucie Soil and Water Conservation District is an on-site evaluation of agricultural irrigation systems. The evaluation begins with observations and measurements of the system in operation. The information collected is then analyzed to identify potential problems with the system design, operation and maintenance. A confidential report is generated which makes recommendations for system improvements if needed. In addition, an irrigation scheduling guide is developed for the specific crop and site. The end result of such an evaluation could result in water and fuel savings for the grower. In St. Lucie County, an evaluation can be arranged by calling the St. Lucie Soil and Water Conservation District Office at (772) 461-4546.
