Highlands County Youth Citrus Project Citrus Tree Silent Auction

The Youth Citrus Program has grown over the past three years. This year, fifty seven young people have successfully grown citrus trees that they will exhibit and sell at the Highlands County Fair February 10 - 18, 2012.

The participants will sell their citrus tree in a "Silent Auction", whereby individuals or businesses can bid on these trees. In the fair exhibit at the fair a Silent Auction Bid Sheet will be displayed by each tree where individuals can make their bid.

The trees are all Hamlin on Swingle in excellent condition in 5-gallon pots. The trees are inspected by the DPI, and can be used as resets in your grove.

I would encourage you to go to the fair and bid on a tree or trees in the "**Silent Auction**". If you are unable to go to the fair, you can contact me and I will place your bid(s) for you. You can bid by entrant name, for a tree, or group of trees. If you want to bid all you need to do is contact me and let me know how many trees you want to bid on. The Silent Auction will end Thursday evening February 16th.

The Champion and Reserve Champion Trees will sell in the **live Auction** during the Junior Livestock Sale on Thursday evening, February 16th at 5:30 p.m. at the Fairgrounds. Again, if you cannot go to the live auction and would like to bid on these two champion trees, let me know and I can bid for you, all you need to do is give me a limit.

A third option is to "Add-On" to the sale price of the citrus trees being sold at the fair. The "Add-On" rules require you add-on to all of the trees and the add-on minimum bid is \$5.00 per tree for all of the 57 trees in additional increments of \$5.00 per tree for all of the 57 trees.

I encourage you to purchase a citrus tree(s) at the fair to support these young people in their citrus project. If you would like a list of names of young people who will be exhibiting trees, let me know.

The Youth Citrus Project is an effective means to introduce young people in Highlands County to the Highlands Citrus Industry and the citrus business.

The Spring Citrus Blossom has begun for Central Florida Citrus

The following is an excerpt from Dr Albrigo's Flower Bud induction Advisory # 4 for 2011-2012

Mother Nature has not been friendly, but the weather has lived up to a La Niña year. The Flowering Monitor Model indicates that a first wave of flower buds was initiated between Dec. 3rd and 12th, depending on the location, earliest initiation was in mid-Florida. The full bloom dates for this first wave of flower buds is about February 7 to 17. A second wave of bloom is expected February 25th to 31st. Finally, a third wave of flowering is projected for Immokalee and the Central Florida area about March 10th to 14th. Next CHMA Coordinated Area Spray

Why is it important to predict the blossom occurrence and duration?

New leaf flush happens at the same time as blossom which is accompanied with a frenzy of psyllid breeding and feeding and potential acquisition and transmission of citrus greening (HLB).

The latest cycle of the FDACS/USDA Psyllid Survey shows psyllids numbers to be very low in Highlands County following the Dormant Danatol Coordinated Area Spray during the first three weeks in January. Emergence of flush and warming weather conditions will trigger rapid psyllid build-up.

Some growers are spraying in February with a miticide/insecticide material such as Movento or Portal. Be sure and consider the label restriction as to Bee Activity.

The general outlook for the **next CHMA Coordinated Area Spray** indicates an OP Spray at the end of the blossom period in March. This is a critical Coordinated Area Spray to be the most effective means of knocking psyllid populations back down to low levels and minimizing the potential for the spread of citrus greening. Stay in touch with your CHMA Area Captain as to the
