# Flower Bud Induction

Dr. Albrigo's Flower Bud Induction Program is back up and going for this season. This is a good tool for growers to use to predict flowering in citrus. Flowering coincides with the first growth flush for the season hence it is a great aid in predicting the new growth flush and timing sprays for Asian Citrus Psyllids.

# **Internet Course Offering - Agriculture and Environmental Quality**

Spring semester 2010, beginning Thursday, January 7, and will continue each Thursday at 10:40 – 11:30 a.m. through mid-April. The course format will be primarily Internet chat sessions, taught by Dr. He, an associate professor of Soil Fertility and Environmental Chemistry at the UF/IFAS Indian River Research and Education Center. Topics will include:

- concepts relating to agriculture, the environment and its quality, and the relationships among the three as they relate to sustainable agriculture.
- wetlands and soil components, their properties and functions such as filtration, waste disposal, and contamination screening.

# Students will learn:

- how to identify sources of pollution,
- how to manage nutrients so that they will not transform into contamination.

- how to process waste, land management techniques, integrated pest management
- the particulars of the Food Quality Act and wetland protection legislation.

The course is designed for growers and others interested in protection of the environment with best management practices for agriculture.
