CHMA Activity

<u>Coordinated Area Spray for</u> <u>Avon Park/Lake Letta; Lake Letta/Sebring; Bairs Den CHMA</u> (from Steve Farr CHMA Captain)

It has been approx. 6-7 weeks since the regional Dimethoate spray done in early September. The recommendation is to early November making a Coordinated Area Spray. Most growers are talking about using Mustang.

There will be 3 planes available to go during this time. The approximate cost should be less than \$11.00 per acre. If interested reply to Steve Farr and we can work it out, some of the growers on this e-mail list have participated in the past and will be contacted next week to get coordinated.

Also will be several contract ULV machines to do the more sensitive areas and will be available to be contracted at the same time.

A Coordinated Area Spray is planned for the Central Highlands 17/27 CHMA.

The coordinated spray will take place during the month of November. The selected Mode of action for this spray will be an Organophosphate. If the use of an Organophosphate is not possible due to harvesting activities, a Neonicotinoid should be used as a substitute.

Coordinated Area Sprays are proven Effective

The main thing is to coordinate applications with your neighbors to minimize re-infestation of Psyllids moving from area to area. Research data and grower experience verify this fact. I have heard from the experts that neutral El Niño conditions are firmly in place for this upcoming winter. Studies show that nearly all the severe freezes that have occurred since the late 1800s have occurred during neutral El Niño conditions.

FAWN Freeze Alert Text Message System

Again this year the Florida Agricultural Weather Network (FAWN) is providing a service tool to alert you when cold weather will occur that may require your making cold protection decisions. FAWN can help you maximize your cold protection program with the FAWN Freeze Alert Tool.

This tool will send to your computer, cell phone or iPad and alert message at whatever temperature you select to initiate cold protection. It will also provide an alert the following morning when the Wet-Bulb Based Irrigation Cutoff Temperature has been reached for your area. This is the safe cutoff temperature based on current FAWN conditions, indicating the temperature and dew point have risen above the threshold whereby you can turn off your irrigation without risk of super-cooling.
