Produce Safety Class

Did you know that every farm producing edibles needs to have at least one person trained in the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA)? This class provides that training. Attendees will learn about produce safety; worker health, hygiene, and training; soil amendment safety; animal effects on produce safety; agricultural water safety; postharvest handling safety; and developing a farm food safety plan. Even citrus producers should have a trained person. The class takes a day and costs \$25. It is being held in Tavares at the Extension office on Sept. 24. Online registration.
